## OUR MISSION

In partnership with the community, SCAP develops and implements lasting solutions for people of all ages to move out of poverty

## OUR VISION

SCAP envisions a community without poverty where everyone:

- Has safe and affordable housing
- Has quality education and learning experiences
- Seeking employment can earn a livable wage
- Is treated with dignity and respect
- Feels invested in and connected to the community, and
- Has fair access to health and wellness supports

## 60 YEARS

SCAP has been a trusted resource for helping people find their way out of poverty since 1965

## COMMUNITY NEED

18,013 residents in Schenectady County live below the federal poverty level

## HOUSING STABILITY

87% of clients receiving our housing services maintain stable housing, preventing homelessness

## RENTAL ASSISTANCE

\$1,016,674 provided in rental assistance to prevent homelessness

## EMPLOYMENT

94 Individuals gained employment or developed employability skills

## SERVICES

Our comprehensive services helped 6,896 people in 2,792 families in Schenectady County

## REENTRY SERVICES

Customers in our reentry services achieved a recidivism rate of only 2%, compared to the NYS rate of 19%

## BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

61 individuals received comprehensive Behavioral Health Services

## EMERGENCY FUND

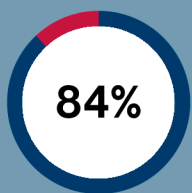
131 individuals in crisis received financial support to meet immediate needs for housing, utilities, medical care, and essential services

## COMMUNITY RESOURCE NETWORK

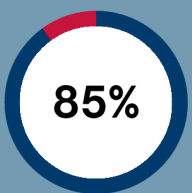
1,399 households served through comprehensive support services, including:

- Referrals for food and clothing

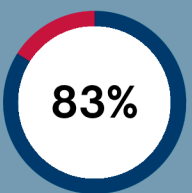
Children Ages 0-5 Meeting or Exceeding Age-Appropriate Skills in Spring/Summer 2024



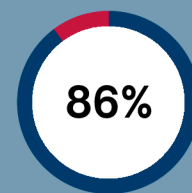

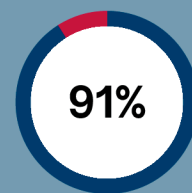

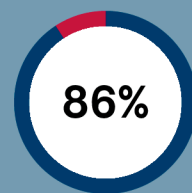
