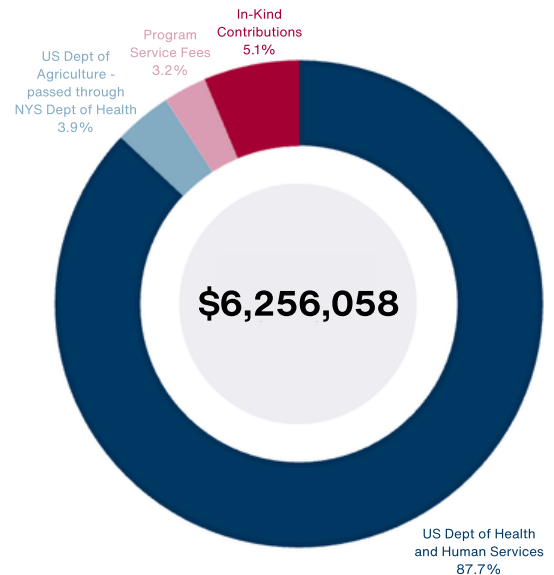

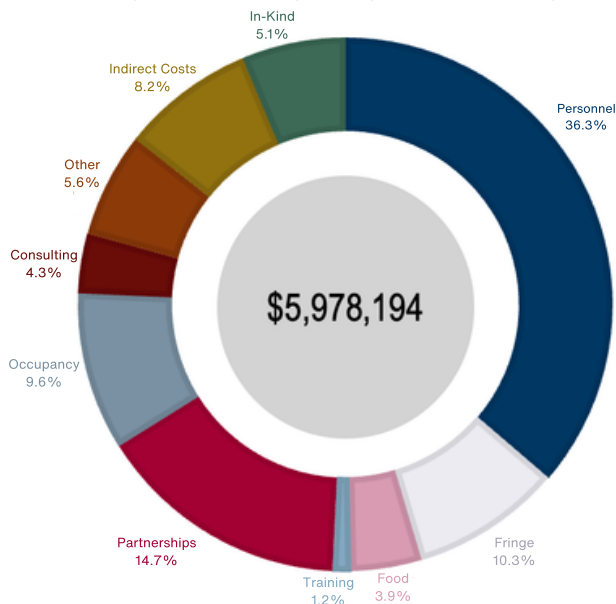
2025 Funding Sources

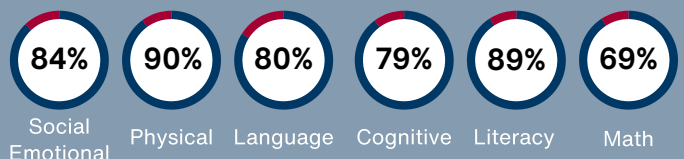
